- 2. How can internal and external champions help government to make these changes?
 - Sharing of countywide data from AC Seniors' Needs Assessment survey
 - Develop a training for government to have Aging 101 training course available
 - Have RBA framework in place for senior needs/programs
- 3. What kinds of strategies can be employed to prioritize the needs of seniors across jurisdictions (county to city, city to city)?
 - Common goals / established models available and utilize those going forward
 - Use leverage of BOS influence to address 8 domains of age-friendly community at a city level as city priorities
 - Have an accountability based program/framework in place
 - Attendance of leadership/executives at an age-friendly conference
 - Report progress/status of senior services/programs to BOS
