#### **Current Projects**

#### Focused on the following priorities:

- **Health & Wellness:** Mobile Farmers Market
- Communication: PUC grant attained to enhance use of Senior Centers as means of information sharing to seniors
- Housing: Partnering with organizations focused around affordable housing solutions for people on fixed incomes (current: Meeting with home sharing companies)
- Open spaces: Work with Parks & Rec to facilitate senior playgrounds and other accommodations to meet community needs (current target: Mosswood)

#### **Continuing Our Momentum**

- Livable Oakland Committee meets with City Council members to dial goals down to the district level
- Attend City Planning sessions regarding Downtown Oakland Specific Plan and other relevant projects
- Assist in seeking long-term solutions for food desert areas
