Informing the Berkeley Age Friendly Plan


- Community survey
- 2 focus groups with community partners
 - Faith-based community
 - Monolingual Spanish-speaking
- Informational interviews with 18 City staff from 9 Departments to identify completed and pending projects that consider the needs of Berkeley's older adults
